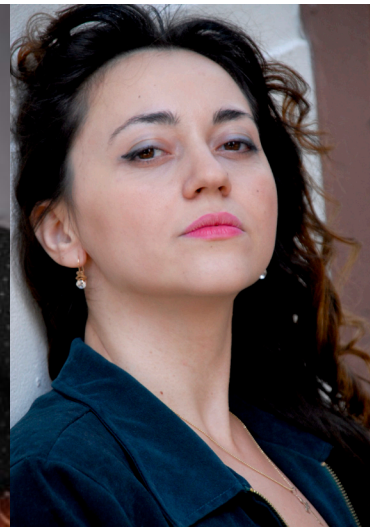
Stanichka Dimitrova has been a first prize winner of the Barbara Krakauer Scholarship Award at the Associated Music Teachers League in New York and of the Hopes, Talents, Masters competition in Dobrich, Bulgaria, among others. She is a recent Juilliard graduate, currently pursuing her DMA at Stony Brook University, studying with Philip Setzer, Pamela Frank, Soovin Kim, and Philippe Graffin.

Kariné Poghosyan began her music studies in her native Yerevan, Armenia, studying at the Romanos Melikian Music College and Komitas State Conservatory. She made her orchestral debut at the age of 14 with Beethoven's Piano Concerto No. 1. She received her Master's and DMA degrees at the Manhattan School of Music under Dr. Arkady Aronov. She was the first MSM graduate in over twenty years to have completed her doctoral studies in only two years.

Ms. Dimitrova and Ms. Poghosyan have both performed numerous concertos with the Musica Bella Orchestra.
